

Marking obligation CE & UKCA



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Directive 2014/30/EU

The EMC Directive specifies the manner in which the electromagnetic compatibility (EMC) of electrically operated equipment in the member countries of the EU should be. According to Article 1 of this Directive, the scope extends to all electrical and electronic apparatus, installations and systems which contain electrical or electronic components and which, according to Article 2, may cause electromagnetic disturbances or the operation of which may be affected by such disturbances.

According to the confirmations of the Chamber of Industry and Commerce (IHK) Ostwürttemberg, the products of icotek GmbH are

not subject to CE marking

Explanation:

1. do not cause electromagnetic interference
2. do not constitute equipment in the sense of, according to the directive, apparatus or fixed installations
3. components/assemblies are placed on the market as preliminary products for end products

The CE marking obligation applies to the end product. The manufacturer of the end product is obliged to comply with the relevant directive, to undergo the conformity assessment procedure and to affix the relevant notice on the type plate.

If products not subject to mandatory marking are marked, this suggests a product property, similar to a product seal, and thus represents a gross misuse and is prohibited according to Art. 30 II Regulation (EC) No. 765/2008!

UKCA

A CE marking obligation for the United Kingdom according to UKCA will come into force from January 1, 2023. So far, we as the company icotek GmbH are exempt as for the CE as well as the UKCA marking obligation.
